- marks are not deducted for errors
- marks are not deducted for omissions

What remains of the city?

There is much preserved of the Roman city including the main street through the centre of the city. This is bordered by impressive columns, some of which are still standing. There is the forum flanked by colonnades, a triumphal arch dedicated to the emperor Hadrian, an amphitheatre and fountains. At the north end of the city is the hippodrome; a

further to the Bronze Age. The remains that have been uncovered reveal many buildings and structures of the Roman city. Following occupation in the Byzantine period, it continued to flourish under Arabic rule. While it appears to have been deserted for several centuries until records of its habitation reappear under the Ottoman Empire, new research is finding evidence of inhabitants such as Mamluks, Jewish and Muslim settlements.
